Park Updates

On Thursday 9th February, the FOBP Committee met with the new Parks Victoria Senior Ranger Adrian Howard (replaces Des Lucas).

Margaret Hunter summarized as follows:

Adrian has been working as a permanent appointment to replace Des Lucas who retired from Parks Victoria after 27 and a half years in the role in April 2022. The contact ranger for the Friends of Braeside Park is Janelle Cadd. Contact details and working hours will be circulated by Margaret to all committee members and telephone numbers and other relevant information for issues that arise in the Park.

The current ranger hours for rostered times are 7.00 am to 7.00 pm, with a duty ranger rostered on at the weekends who patrols and assists Park visitors as required.

Adrian outlined his background experiences over many years with other organisations with Zoos Victoria, Melbourne Water, and most recently the challenging role of replacing Des Lucas in his current role, with the loss of over 100 years of ranger experience with Digger, Des, and Ernie as well. He commented that it has been a challenging time for rangers and the Friends with changes to policies, temporary rangers, and a number of issues. His plan for the first six months was to learn about the park environment and stakeholders, including consultation with the Mens Shed, and other groups. Following that to work with the park stakeholders to manage Braeside Park as a team with these groups, and their varying interests. He noted that ranger Kelly is returning from secondment to Mallacoota in May which will assist in working with ranger staff in Braeside Park.

We put to Adrian a number of questions which he answered.

Number one question was about the Red Gum Toilet closure. He said that various options were being examined including sewage connection or repair to existing system. No re-opening date was provided.

The other major question was about communicating policies to the public through signage around the park in relation to no camping, no hunting, no pets, no drones. He stated that he was working on increasing the number and quality of signs.

The meeting was positive and supportive.

Has anyone noticed the plethora of insects this summer at Braeside park? There has a been particularly large number of dragonflies and damselflies. If you don't know the difference between the two, the pictures below may help-the first two pictures are of an emerald dragonfly, and the pretty blue insect is a damselfly.

There has also been a lot of beautiful little jewel spiders in the park. These usually appear between December and March. People have been enjoying watching them spin their webs and capture small insects, along the walking paths.

The Dashed Geometrid, which resembles a moth more than a butterfly. You can see its clever camouflage in this image- it looks like a nearby leaf!




The Pieridae cabbage white butterfly

There was a bit of excitement when a Swamp Harrier hovered overhead. We managed to work out the songs of the Yellow Robin and the Golden Whistler. Nice work. It's evident we are developing our skills in bird identification by sharing our knowledge. A fun way to learn. We also had an encounter with a hungry Echidna, and observed a beautiful native orchid.




Residents
