The Friends of Braeside Park met for a Break Up walk of Karkarook Park and BBQ lunch at the Park Office. The Friends can be proud of completing a few projects in 2013-14 such as, the Possum and Pelican Art Stump, installation of the water tanks at the office and the nursery, some more taxidermy birds for displays and planting 26 *Cupressus macrocarpa* var. *auaea* along Cypress Drive. The Wednesday Group commonly called Ernie's A Team have been busy grubbing out Burgan and Acacia in the Heathland, mowing and weeding in the Grasslands, planting the last nine Cypress Trees and while Ernie was on holidays, were roped into digging holes for fences for Digger and Max. This group is small in number but big in achievements. They naturally are always looking for new people to join this happy crew and share the work load. If you want to join, just turn up Wednesday at 9am at the Braeside Park Office in sturdy shoes. Morning Tea is provided!

While the Friends are going into holiday mode, there is an interesting project coming up for those interested in birds (the feathered variety!). BirdLife Australia is keen to find some interested people who would like survey birds in the Woodlands and Heathlands in Braeside Park. BirdLife will provide a training day at Braeside Park, *so if you have an interest in birds or are a confirmed "twitcher"*, this is the program for you. The bird surveys timetable will be decided by the group. The date for the training session has yet to be decided but if there is anyone interested in becoming part of the Braeside Park "twitchers" group, please contact Ranger Des on 9265 7300.

The last of the Frog Watch surveys was held in November and will not resume until April but Rangers Des and Glen did a rabbit survey in early December. Earlier results in July and October found numbers were rising fast. In July there were 7 rabbits per spotlight kilometre and then 28 in early October. So as the rabbits produce their third litter of the season, December results were sure to be astronomical. A walk in the early morning or evenings shows many rabbits boldly feeding on green playing fields.

Summer in the Park escaping the hot summer sun or simply walking or riding along the dirt paths or picnicking with friends and family is both mentally and physically relaxing so why not contact one of the Rangers on 9265 7300 and join The Friends' Group keeping Braeside Park the local haven it is.

Des' Mystery Tour to West Gippsland

With our capable and experienced tour guides, Des, Kathryn and John at the wheel of our bus, 12-14 participants recently took part in a mystery tour to West Gippsland on 8 November 2014. We were once again well fed and watered by morning tea provided by Jan and Peter Holt, Kathryn and other members of our motley group.

We went on winding roads, with an unintended detour of ten kilometres – the road was closed – to visit the famous Ada Tree. With a walk along a rough track with some boards to the famous tree, it is well worth a visit. It is one of the oldest trees in Gippsland and a local attraction in the Noojee area. It is over 300 years old, 76 metres tall with a circumference of 15 metres.

We then travelled to the famous Noojee Railway bridge for a scenic lunch spot and the opportunity to walk along the historic railway bridge. While the path was steep, the view was good and the work involved in building this bridge was an engineering marvel of its time given the isolation of the area and limited access except by rail. The line was opened in 1919 as a branch line from Warragul and closed in sections from 1954-1958. The trestle bridge at Noojee was destroyed by fire in 1939 (Black Friday), 1926 also and re-built. It is 102 metres long and 21 metres high, with 19 piles. There was goods and passengers carried from Flinders Street to Noojee, a journey of 143 kms which took 6 hours. It was built to support timber production in the area with 28 mills in the area in the 1920's. Services were cut in the 1930's and it became a goods only line in the 1940's. It is the tallest surviving trestle bridge in Victoria and has been part of a long-term project to restore railway facilities at Noojee with the support of the Noojee and District Historical Society. We eagerly await this trip.

We next visited the famous Toorong Falls with a very steep walk after lunch. This tested most of the group, with many stops on the way up to admire the view. The many photographers also lugged their photographic gear up the slope without effort. When we reached the half-way point, we discovered that some of the group had found the less steep albeit longer route to reach the top of the falls. But all other than Des, declined his invitation for a further steep climb. When I got home the view was on the internet, so we were not disappointed. We also had quizzes and games with Kathryn, which we all enjoyed. We arrived at Braeside Park 30 minutes late due to the unknown detour, with a scenic drive enjoyed by all. Thank you to Des for organising another fabulous mystery tour, Kathryn for her games and quizzes and also her delicious sausage rolls and other treats and John for driving us. It was considered even better than the last tour!

The next mystery tour is planned for Walhalla in 2015 and should be a popular trip.





The Famous Elsie's Apple Slice

Most of the Friends of Braeside Park will remember our past Secretary, Elsie, and her delicious apple slice which seemed to feature at the AGM annually. She generously gave me the recipe and I would like to share it with all. Elsie called it "Apple Slice" but I have always called it "Elsie's Apple Slice."

Ingredients:

Vanilla Cake Mix; 1 cup of desiccated coconut; 125 grams of melted butter; 1 tin of apple pie filling (or slice and stew 3 Granny Smith apples); 300ml light sour cream; cinnamon

Method:

Mix cake mix, coconut and melted butter.

Pour into a slice tray lined with baking paper or greased.

Bake in moderate oven (180 degrees) for 20 minutes.

Remove from oven and pour over the slice the apple slices and then top with sour cream.

Sprinkle with cinnamon and bake in oven for a further 20 minutes.

Cool completely before slicing.

This slice works well with cherries, rhubarb or any soft cooked fruit. It also works with Gluten Free Vanilla Cake mixes. It is a winner! Thanks Elsie.

The flowering of the River Red Gums attracted a very large number of Lorikeets over November and December and it's no wonder given the forest smelt so sweet! Most were Rainbow and Musk and a very small number of Purple Crowned and Scaly-breasted were seen or heard by those with a keen eye and ear. Latham's Snipe were also back in the park and there have been many family groups of Tawny Frogmouth spotted in the trees along the tracks.
