Propagation Members Visit to Greenlink Nursery

After propagation on the third Sunday in March, three Friends of Braeside Park (FOBP), Simon, Vicki and myself, went to the Greenlink Nursery in Heatherton Road, Clayton. Ironically only three of their volunteers were at work too. Marg Seaton generously welcomed us with a cup of coffee and homemade Jaffa Cake. After which she took us on a tour of the nursery which is expanding to accommodate the demand for Council and Gold Course orders of indigenous plants, especially wetland plants. The need for FOBP's nursery to get the hot beds working was glaring as this is where the cuttings are placed with 98% success of all cuttings by Greenlink. The Shed full of seeds was impressive and equally how knowledgeable Marg is at seed identification as she spends most of January sorting the seed collected throughout the previous year into containers, and even Council areas. Then the seeds are yearly sorted on their viability, i.e. after 5 years some seeds are chucked! FOBP had just planted Eucalyptus seed 20 years old! Collecting seed is something we must get on to and that means identification of plants must be prioritised. Marg identified some seeds I had collected, even naming without hesitation, an indigenous creeper, a strangler so not for propagation! The Nursery has been in operation at this location for over 20 years and has and continues to improve the working structure but some basic steps the FOBP nursery could and will adopt are: spray bottle of 10% methylate spirits to sanitize secateurs and benches between species propagation; recording of seeds and cuttings and daily work book of jobs to do and done; purchase of Ezi-Root hormone gel and vermiculate for mixing with perlite (1 part to 3 parts) for cutting propagation; investigating building boxes to protect seeds from vermin who like large seeds such as Lomandra! Long term, FOBP could establish a fenced bay to store propagation mixture from SureGrow which is finer and probably more economical too. I noticed NO RABBIT holes which is also something to work towards with Parks Victoria. A huge thank you for Marg and the Greenlink team for sharing their workplace structure and daily practice. I am sure this visit will inspire change in FOBP nursery.

• It is pleasing to report that autumn has come to Braeside Park and the end of daylight saving. The night walk program began on 14 April with 13 participants and many sightings. Bird Survey Group

In February, the bird survey occurred on a summer morning with only 13 species being identified. Group members reported the conditions as very warm and eerily quiet, so very low numbers compared with the average count. However, one of the species spotted was a wedge-tailed eagle. This species was also reported flying over the park the following weekend.

In March, the group surveyed the Heathland in autumn conditions. It was cloudy, and cool after recent rainfall and there was an abundance of birds in the Heathland. We observed 28 species with high numbers of rainbow lorikeets, wattlebirds, spotted and striated pardalotes and noisy miners.

We also heard a fan-tailed cuckoo calling near the Dingley drain. Also of interest, was a kestrel flying overhead. For me, the highlight of the day was observing 14 yellow-tailed black cockatoos as they defended their positions on a dead tree from one very upset sulphur-crested cockatoo. The chatter and the objections were loud, but the sulphur refused to budge!

Did you know that some people have seen over 30 different species of birds within a few hours at the park?.. and that there is a regular bird survey done by members of the Friends Of Braeside Park group who observe and record species of birds?


